Like most people and organizations, January of 2020 began with the great feeling of a new year, new goals, and new energy to accomplish great things. Not a full 2 months in we were looking at a life threatening, industry threatening and community changing pandemic, the likes of which none of us had experience with, or a frame of reference for. The coronavirus (COVID - 19) pandemic caused an unprecedented challenge to the day to day operations at Catholic Health Services. Strategies, policies, initiatives had to be reexamined and changed to best meet the needs of our patients, staff and community. Caring for the vulnerable population we serve intensified our sense of responsibility.

It is during difficult times that we find our strength and determination. Our priorities were clear as we focused on necessary strategies. We take comfort in reporting that no employee lost their job during the pandemic and our patient satisfaction sores remained strong, a true testament to the commitment our staff has to the delivery of excellent care and compassionate. CHS administered over 43,000 Covid tests on patients and staff with only 1% positivity rate, better than all averages, using 6 different platforms to ensure access and timely, accurate results. At the time of this report, over 80% of our staff, patients, residents and clients have been successfully vaccinated and protected, enhancing further safety in our outlying community.

In spite of the unprecedented circumstances, through the never ending dedication and efforts of over 2,500 team members in our eight different ministries of service, we delivered over \$12million in charitable or uncompensated care to those who needed most. We remain committed to rising to every new challenge and fulfilling our CHS Mission with quality care and quality service.

Amazing job TEAM CHS! Supporting the Catholic Health Services' organizational sponsorship of \$25,000, through individual awareness and fund-raising events the staff raised \$36,000 for the Alzheimer's Association. Thank you for your hard work and dedication to our mission! Team CHS did it!

On Saturday, November 16th, Team CHS joined over 5,000 community members at the Miami-Dade Walk to End Alzheimer's. As this year's presenting sponsor, we had the largest presence at the walk with over 500 walkers signed up to participate. It was an early start

at Museum Park as thousands of supporters of all ages gathered to remember their loved ones and support the Alzheimer's cause.

Eager to begin the walk everyone gathered behind our CEO Joseph Catania, at the start line we cut the ribbon signifying the official start of the walk. It was great to witness the sea of Team CHS walkers in their team shirts walking together to remember, honor, care and fight for those with Alzheimer's disease.

In charge of the photo booth, Catholic Health Services volunteers had fun with walkers as they sent pictures to friends, families and their social media pages.



A highlight of the day was the Promise Garden, a mission-focused experience allowing walkers to choose a colored flower and write their reason for participating in the event. Each flower color represented a different connection to the disease: blue honored someone currently living with Alzheimer's or dementia, purple for remembering a loved one lost to the disease, yellow represented those supporting or caring for someone with Alzheimer', and the orange was for those who supported the vision of a world without Alzheimer's. The white flower represented the hope of the first survivor of Alzheimer's.



## Then came the Pandemic-

Leadership mobilized quickly to gather, study and implement the ever changing volumes of information and regulations in order to secure a safe environment for our patients, residents and staff.

Personal protective equipent (PPP) was procured and distributed along with policies and easy to access educational and communication tools. Partnerships with community resources were enhanced to streamline rapic responses and adjustments as needed.

Our CHS hospitals designed specific environments for Isolation and Recovery Units with the assistance consulting infectious disease and pumlonary clinicians to contain any possible spread within a facility.

A unique system was deleveloped internally, with prioprietary software and deployed to all medical campuses for screening at entry. Kiosks at each lobby area are supervised by trained personnel with secondary oversight by our Directors of Nursing and physician reviewers to ensure precision. This tool has delivered over 185,000 accurate screenings, further expanding the safety protocols in place that have proven so effective in keeping our patient popluations safe and healthy.



Numerous modifications were made across the board to deliver necessary care and social services to our residents while maintaining strict social distancing and personal safety protocols.

Easy access digital information boards and web-based tools were updated in real-time to keep all team members informed of updates, changes, resources, helpful guidelines and other vital information to facilitate daily operations and ensure continued safety.







## Community Benefit Breakdown October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019




