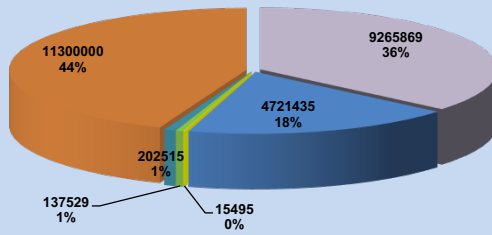
Vision Statement

Catholic Health Services Community Benefit Breakdown October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021

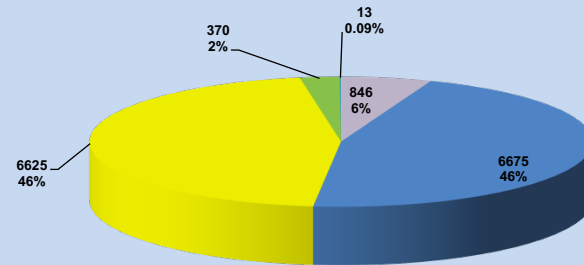

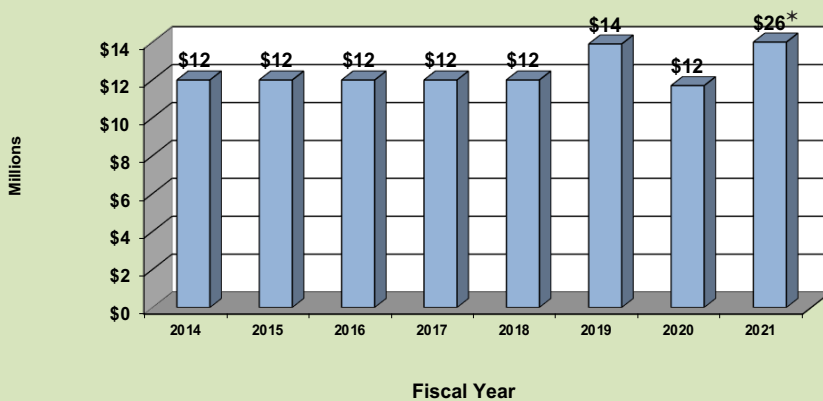
Catholic Health Services Community Benefit Breakdown - Persons Served October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021

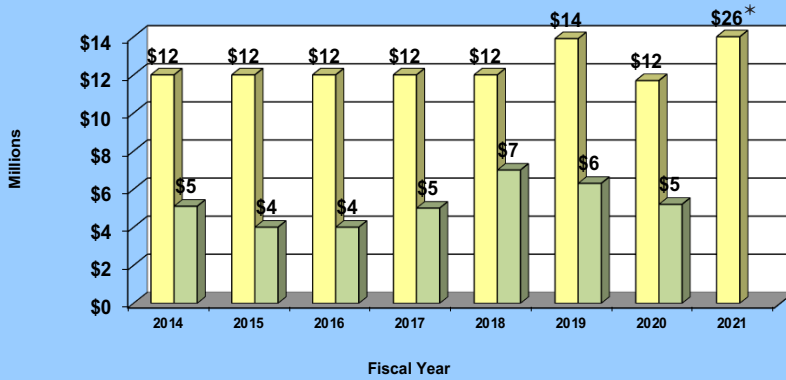

Catholic Health Services Community Benefit Provided



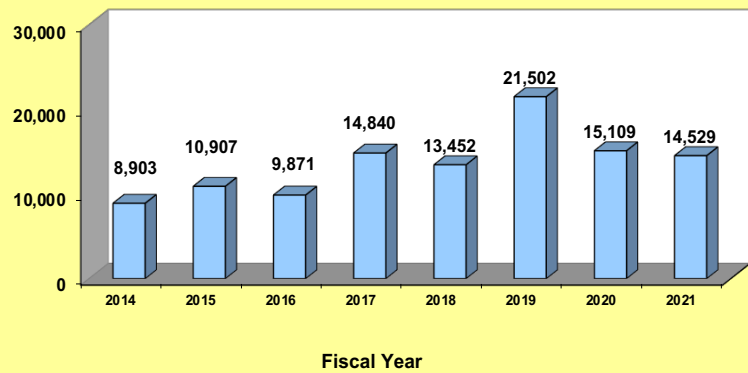
