## FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Miami's St. Joseph Towers and Residence repairs due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 08097). An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 06, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Floodplain:	Project is a critical action located in the Flood Zone Shaded X, otherwise known as the 500-year floodplain, per Miami-Dade County FIRM Panel #12011C0362H dated 08/18/2014.
Proposed Work and Purpose:	The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Miami completed repairs to building interiors, roofing, and a catch basin at St. Joseph Towers. Building interior repairs include ceiling, carpet, a fire alarm, a window, drywall, baseboard molding, exhaust fans, interior light fixtures, and bathroom vanities and plumbing. At the St. Joseph Residence, a storm shutter lock, carpet, roofing, a door, stucco walls, ceiling, A/C unit and components, an exhaust fan, and exterior light pole and fixtures were replaced. All repairs were up to current codes and standards, and an Emergency Management Plan exists for the building that identifies steps to minimize flood damage.
Project Alternatives:	An alternative location is not practicable as elements are part of a larger facility and relocation may adversely impact social or economic resources for the community. The no action alternative is not feasible as the facility would continue to be vulnerable to further damages and pose safety hazards to the occupants and visitors.
